# What you can and can't bring during the Household Hazardous Waste Days



## Can

We **will** be able to accept the following types of household hazardous waste **free of charge**:

- ✓ Aerosols
- ✓ Household chemicals and cleansers
- ✓ Fire extinguishers
- ✓ Garden pesticides and fertilizers
- ✓ Paint
- ✓ Photographic chemicals
- ✓ Wood preservatives, treatments and varnishes

## Can't

Unfortunately, we **will not** be able to accept:

- ✗ Ammunition, explosives or marine flares
- ✗ Asbestos
- ✗ Commercial hazardous waste
- ✗ Fireworks
- ✗ Gas canisters (full or part-full)
- ✗ Petrol, diesel or any other fuels



### Advice to householders visiting on Household Hazardous Waste Days

1. Products for disposal should be kept in their original containers and not mixed together.
2. Containers should be clearly labelled where possible.
3. When transporting hazardous waste make sure it is properly sealed to avoid leakage.
