### Bullock Park Report

Once again, Bullock Park has had a successful year, thanks to maintaining all our last year's activities, retaining the contract for day-time use with Norfolk Fire and Rescue service and the support of the Parish Council. This allowed us to continue with our improvement programme. We have completed an extensive refurbishment of our electrics and now completely meet all current standards and regulations, as well as being more user friendly. Having sprung a major water leak, we took the opportunity to replace the whole water supply with modern plastic piping. Our pavilion frontage has been improved with a new patio and needs some levelling and grassing in front of it to complete. This work will be part of our programme for the coming year which will also include new drainage from our septic tank, re-laying the frontage to Changing rooms and dealing again with entrance and car park potholes. We cannot rely on keeping NR&R beyond their contract ending in August and are trying to balance tackling major projects while we have their income with building a healthy reserve so that B.P. continues to be a viable facility. We ended our financial year with a balance of £19,696.78, an increase of £6463.08 from the previous year.

At our AGM on 22<sup>nd</sup> May, the current trustees were proposed by their respective organisations to serve a further year so the committee is unchanged. David Hill is chairman and together with Marlene Secker represents the P.C., Sarah Howlett is Treasurer and Football rep., Ady Friend is Cricket club rep., Bob Hunter is pavilion users rep and Sylvia Slaughter is secretary.

We would like to thank all dog walkers who pick up their own dogs and other dog's poo; everyone who picks up litter, especially Brian Newton, and our gate open/closers Rodger Knights and John Walker. Finally a big thank you to retiring P.C. chairman Paul Chubbock for his untiring help and support both official and personal during his time in Office.
